## Graduate Faculty Membership Criteria

The following two criteria must be met:

1. Doctorate in field and regular tenure-track appointment.
- 2\*. The applicant shall have established or maintained a strong continued scholarly record as judged by the Doctoral/Graduate Nominating Committee. This criterion may be met, for example, by:
  - a. Two refereed publications of merit (articles in journals of national or international reputation, etc.).
  - or: b. Publication of a scholarly book or textbook.
  - or: c. One publication of merit as described in (a) plus two or more of the following seven items:
    1. Presentation and/or proceedings of research in progress at a significant refereed regional, national, or international professional meeting.
    2. Editorial review board membership for a national or international journal.
    3. Other recognition of special scholarly contribution such as the development of a significant case study used for teaching purposes, an essay in a scholarly anthology or chapter in a book.
    4. Evidence of significant successful grantsmanship.
    5. Evidence of applied scholarship via consulting or public service that results in demonstrable impact on the larger community (beyond the sponsored organization) or the discipline.
    6. Significant academic or professional software.
    7. Significant academic or professional patent.

\*Activities in item 2 should be within the last five years.

**Doctoral Faculty Membership Criteria**

The following two criteria must be met:

1. Doctorate in field and regular tenure-track appointment.
- 2\*. The applicant shall have established or maintained a strong continued scholarly record as judged by the Doctoral/Graduate Nominating Committee. This criterion may be met, for example, by:
  - a. Four refereed publications of merit (articles in journals of national or international reputation, etc.).
  - or b. Three refereed publications of merit (articles in journals of national or international reputation, etc.) and one significant refereed regional, national, or international proceedings.
  - or: c. Publication of a scholarly book or textbook, and one significant refereed regional, national or international proceedings.
  - or: d. Two publications of merit as described in (a) plus three or more of the following seven items:
    1. Presentation and/or proceedings of research in progress at a significant refereed regional, national, or international professional meeting.
    2. Editorial review board membership for a national or international journal.
    3. Other recognition of special scholarly contribution such as the development of a significant case study used for teaching purposes, an essay in a scholarly anthology or chapter in a book.
    4. Evidence of significant successful grantsmanship.
    5. Evidence of applied scholarship via consulting or public service that results in demonstrable impact on the larger community (beyond the sponsored organization) or the discipline.
    6. Significant academic or professional software.
    7. Significant academic or professional patent.

\*Activities in item 2 should be within the last five years.

**Associate Graduate Faculty**

A faculty member's application will be evaluated in light of the Bloch School's Graduate Faculty Membership criteria. Each case will be considered individually by judging the degree of variance from the aforementioned criteria.

**Graduate Teaching Faculty**

An individual will be required to submit a current vita that notes, among other things, academic and professional accomplishments. Additionally, the Departmental chair must submit a letter that (1) explains why the individual is being considered to teach a graduate offering and (2) justifies the individual's qualifications to teach at the graduate level.
